November 10, 2021 – “*Seek the LORD, and his strength: seek his face evermore.*” (Psalm 105:4) I’ve been preaching through a sermon series on

Seeking the Face of God and it’s been a timely study to reflect upon my personal fellowship with the Almighty One. Truly, we need the Lord’s strength, but our daily fellowship *with* Him is much more valuable than anything we can accomplish in service *for* Him. It’s a privilege to be on the receiving end of your intercession. Let me share recent answers to prayer along with a few requests for the month ahead.



8 Years in Thailand: We celebrated our 8th Anniversary of arriving in Thailand on November 6th! We kept the celebration simple, due to sickness, but it was good to look back over many photos and recount a multitude of blessings. One great blessing to include was the latest renewal of our 1-year volunteer visa! After 6 months of prayer and preparations, we received this critical extension without any problems. Thanks again for your faithful prayers! It took some work, but we were able to rebuild our tenure as volunteers while moving all paperwork to Chiang Rai province.

Mission Church Update: This has been a slower time of ministry than I anticipated, but we praise God for the weekly investment in the members of our mission church. Each family has been going through some deep challenges lately, so the smaller group has provided more close fellowship with the faithful few. Please pray especially for Heaven and Ruth as they’ve had to deal with several emergencies in the past few weeks including the flooding of their house. Please also pray for good progress in discipleship and the salvation of two lost husbands: Sai Seng and Ricardo. Thank you!



Myanmar Outreach: We are encouraged to hear from faithful men inside of Myanmar that are using every opportunity to preach the Gospel. Bro. Mung and the boys are enduring well and have made good progress on a new shelter – just in



time for the cold weather ahead. Meanwhile, the Myanmar military continues to target civilians and burn homes in Chin State, in an effort to break the will of the people. Despite very limited resources, the Chin resistance forces are standing strong and have suffered very few casualties. There is no explanation for this apart from God’s hand of protection.

Evangelism Contacts: We are praying for more salvation Bible studies as our town reopens following covid restrictions. Please continue to pray for our neighbors, Tan and Min, and for a young lady named Amanda.

Testimony Tracts: Please pray for the Lord to direct us to the right people to interview for a new Gospel tract project. We are gathering salvation testimonies from believers from Myanmar in our area. This outreach provides good opportunities to talk about Biblical salvation and to meet genuine believers. Our goal is to produce some new testimony tracts and videos that address key questions of life. These would lead the reader/viewer to study the Bible online, and also connect those interested with someone that could chat or meet-up with them in person. We appreciate your prayers!

Thanksgiving: We rejoice in God’s faithful provision of friends in the ministry. This year, we look forward to celebrating Thanksgiving with a group of fellow missionaries in Chiang Mai. That will be a blessed time of fellowship. Once again, we are grateful for your faithful support of our family and ministry! May the Lord continue to multiply your investment for souls here in Thailand and Myanmar.
