March 14, 2022 – Burning season has arrived! It’s that time of the year when the intense heat of summer mixes with the smoke-filled skies of burning rice fields. This gives us a new

appreciation for air conditioning and even face masks – which are still required over here. In the midst of these hot days, we are encouraged by many answers to prayer. Let me update you on some of the highlights.



A New Name in Glory! Though I was a bit discouraged by another round of covid-19 sweeping through our mission church, the Lord has reminded me that He never grows weary or has His plans thwarted. We thank God for restored health for each family and the ability to resume our full assembly this past Sunday. It was also a blessing to receive some new guests brought by

Brother Luke. I believe this was the very first time for **An Nai and his wife Pan Ye** to experience a church service. Bro. Luke has been witnessing to An Nai on the job for the last few months and An Nai just trusted in Christ as his personal Lord and Savior! He seems to have genuinely gotten saved and has a desire to follow the Lord in baptism. Please pray for clear understanding and we meet to discuss baptism and church membership. Pray also for the salvation of his wife and that the Lord will use this young couple to help bring Bro. Luke back to faithful church attendance.

Another Divine appointment was meeting a group of S’gaw Karen workers that claim to be Christian but are not attending any church. Khun Hom introduced me to **Saw A-Say-Daw** (left in photo), his wife and friend this past week.

We were able to pray with them, share some Scripture, and encourage them to follow in obedience to God’s Word. A day later, Mr. A was taken to the hospital to treat some severe insomnia. We are asking God to help us build a good relationship with him and a group of 13 Karen friends that work together in loading and unloading trucks of supplies on the border bridge to Myanmar.



Six Families from the Enn Tribe: Bro. Mung and three of his friends preached the Gospel to these families several years ago, and ever since have been witnessing to them at every opportunity. Just recently, these families made the decision to turn their backs on the animistic religion of their community and place their faith in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. Hallelujah! Of course, this decision caused them to be kicked out of their village and so they are moving closer to Bro. Mung, looking to



him for spiritual guidance. Please pray for the Lord to supply their needs and to give Bro. Mung strength and wisdom to teach them from God’s Word. He is excited by this opportunity and we are doing what we can to assist from a distance.

Pray for Myanmar: March 2nd marked 60 years of military control in Myanmar. The latest conflict started one year ago, on February 1st, with active fighting continuing to this day. We are not sure when we will be able to travel back into Myanmar, but are confident that God would have us use our time and resources to help strengthen preachers already in the country.



Family update: Baby Luke continues to grow quickly and should soon receive his very own US Passport. Paul and Ellie are making good progress in homeschooling and Rachel is doing her best to copy everything that they do. In the midst of our normal routines, Anne and I are trying to dedicate more time for Burmese language learning and appreciate your prayers for that. **Thank you for holding the ropes for us** as we minister to souls here in Thailand and Myanmar. We appreciate your sacrificial giving and don’t take that for granted in these days of increased living expenses. May God bless you with multiplied fruit from your investment!
