Hello Pastor and Church Family,

November, 2022

G'day? Howdy? I think I like "howdy", sounds more like me.

Finally the days are getting longer and starting to warm up a bit. We had less rain this year than normal for winter but we made up for it with colder temperatures.

We are packing up and getting ready to move house soon. We've viewed a few houses lately and are hoping and praying that soon we can submit an application and God will provide a new house. Our current house is going on the market very soon. Rentals are so few at the moment that when one comes up for rent there are lots of applicants for one house. We are currently paying \$700.00 a week for rent and are hoping and praying that when we do move that the rent will be somewhat cheaper. So far the houses we have been able to view are in the low \$600 range per week. To move you have to post a security bond of 4 weeks rent plus another two weeks rent up front, of course you get the 4 weeks back when you vacate if there's no issues. It will take around \$4,000 to move house just for the bond plus the actual moving costs. It's not just rent that has gone up in the last two years but everything. Our last electric bill was over \$800 (for 2 months) and a full tank of diesel fuel was \$200 (\$2.29 per liter), petrol is \$2.00 per liter.

Family Camp was a great blessing as always! Great preaching and teaching, fellowship and food as well. We are already looking forward to next year and praying about the theme and God's leading.

We certainly have had our share of sickness lately! Something has gone around and through everybody over the last few weeks. Just as soon as you think its over, it starts all over again. Several have had to see the doctors. The weather changing hasn't helped much either. With Spring also brings pollen and hay fever season too.

Mrs. Trish has been diagnosed with lung cancer. She has been scheduled for surgery to remove the lower lobe of her right lung. She went for the surgery and they were not able to perform it due to a lung infection so she was sent home. She is now waiting for a CT scan and a new PET scan and an updated diagnoses and new surgery date. Please keep her in your prayers. Due to the recent covid mandates and all the doctors and nurses who left their jobs rather than receive a vaccine there is a shortage of medical staff and the result is a backlog of needed surgeries and other care. Pray she gets her surgery and needed care soon.

Mr. Rose continues to have serious headaches quite frequently. She's seen doctors and had scans but so far they can't give her a reason for them. Pray that she can get some help soon or able to seen the right doctor who can help her.

Praise! Jarrod was baptized on the 2nd of Oct. He approached me weeks before and we did some Bible study on scriptural baptism, I gave him some material to read and he had two really serious talks with his parents who were very concerned in the beginning. They were worried he was getting wrapped up in some cult! He assured them he was not and was able to explain his salvation and now his need for baptism and church membership. I just spoke to him about publicly praying in the services and he's ready and very excited about that. It's a real encouragement to watch him grow and mature into the young man God would have him to be. Right now he's doing a trial apprenticeship to become an auto electrician. Just pray that when the trial is over they offer him a four year accredited apprenticeship. He's very grateful and sees the blessings of God on his life since he was saved and then baptized. Pray for his witness and testimony with his family, he's very burdened for them too.

Pray for Miss. Emma, she's still struggling with the decision. We are praying and trying to encourage her all we can but it has to be her that decides what she needs to do.
